**VERMONT AVENUE ET AL., PAVEMENT REHABILITATION PROJECT
AWARD OF CONSULTANT SERVICES AGREEMENT
SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS 2 AND 4
3 VOTES**

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

1. Award a Consultant Services Agreement to David Evans and Associates, Inc., for a not to exceed fee of \$100,000 for design services for Vermont Avenue Et Al., Pavement Rehabilitation Project to be financed with Fiscal Year 2001-02 Road Funds.
2. Authorize the Director of Public Works or his designee to execute such services agreement with the recommended consultant and to establish the effective date to prepare plans, specifications, and estimates for this project.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION

We are recommending that your Board award a Consultant Services Agreements, and authorize the Director of Public Works or his designee to execute a contract with the recommended consultant to prepare construction documents for the proposed Vermont Avenue Et Al., Pavement Rehabilitation Project located in County unincorporated area adjacent to the Harbor/UCLA Medical Center and to establish the effective date of the contract.

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Upon completion and approval of the construction documents, tentatively scheduled for July 2002, we will return to your Board to adopt plans and specifications and to advertise for bids to construct the project.

The recommended Consultant Services Agreement will provide design services for the Vermont Avenue Et Al., project in support of Public Works' Street Pavement Rehabilitation Project. The project is located in County unincorporated area adjacent to the Harbor/UCLA Medical Center (Supervisorial Districts 2 & 4). The project includes two roadway segments: Vermont Avenue from 190th Street to Knox Street and Vermont Avenue from Carson Street to Lomita Boulevard.

As part of our efforts to proceed with street pavement rehabilitation work on County-maintained roads, Public Works has successfully used consulting firms to perform the design work because all available staff is currently committed to other projects.

Implementation of Strategic Plan Goals

This action meets the Strategic Plan Goal of Service Excellence as it will initiate the design of road improvements on Vermont Avenue from 190th Street to Knox Street and from Carson Street to Lomita Boulevard. This project will extend the service life of the roads and improve motorist and pedestrian safety.

FISCAL IMPACT/FINANCING

Financing for the Agreement is available in the 2001-02 Road Fund Budget. There will be no impact to the County's General Fund.

The estimated total project cost, including the design contract, is approximately \$1,000,000.

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The recommended Agreement for the identified Street Pavement Rehabilitation Project is for an aggregate not to exceed fee of \$100,000, including \$11,075 for unforeseen additional work which may arise during progress of the work. Additional work within this allowance will not be performed without prior written authorization from the Director of Public Works.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS

A standard Consultant Services Agreement, previously approved as to form by County Counsel, will be used. The Agreement includes a clause for termination of services upon prior written notice and a renegotiation clause as directed by your Board.

As requested by your Board on August 12, 1997, and as a threshold requirement for consideration of contract award, David Evans and Associates, Inc., is willing to consider Greater Avenues for Independence participants for future employment.

David Evans and Associates, Inc., has demonstrated satisfactory compliance with the County's Child Support Compliance Program.

ENVIRONMENTAL DOCUMENTATION

A finding of environmental impact is not required for Consultant Services Agreements for design services.

CONTRACTING PROCESS

On February 1, 1999, a Request for Proposals was issued to 88 firms from Public Works' list of qualified consultants. Thirty-two firms responded to the request. An Evaluation Committee, consisting of Public Works' civil engineering staff, evaluated the proposals. The evaluation of the firms was based on technical expertise, proposed work plan, experience, personnel qualifications, and understanding of the work requirements. These

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evaluations were completed without regard to race, creed, color, or gender. Based on the review and evaluation of these proposals, Public Works is recommending David Evans and Associates, Inc., as the best qualified firm to perform the required services for the identified project.

Participation by Community Business Enterprises (CBE) in the project is encouraged through Public Works' CBE Outreach Program and the requirement that consultants demonstrate their good faith efforts to utilize CBEs. David Evans and Associates, Inc., is aware of Public Works' CBE Outreach Program and their proposed CBE participation is on file with Public Works.

Public Works maintains a database of consultants for design services, which is the main source of soliciting proposals. As requested by your Board on February 3, 1998, and to further increase consultant awareness of contracting opportunities with Public Works, a Request for Qualifications for these services was listed on the County Office of Small Business website.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS)

There will be no negative impact on current County services or projects during the performance of the recommended consultant services.
