Proposition 49 is the After School Education and Safety Program Act which promotes after school programs for more than one million school aged kids that are without needed quality programs to keep them safe and off the streets. Studies show that kids in after school programs stay in school, get higher grades, improve their standardized test scores, dramatically reduce their participation in gangs, reduce their stealing by two-thirds, and reduce violent crime by half.

Proposition 49 will also make State grants available to every public elementary and middle school in California that wants to provide an after school program for its students and Proposition 49 allows each school or school district to design their own after school program, so long as they offer activities like tutoring, homework assistance, educational enrichment, computer training and physical recreation.
