APPROVAL OF SETTLEMENT AGREEMENT WITH UNITED AMERICAN INDIAN INVOLVEMENT, INC. (ALL SUPERVISORIAL DISTRICTS) (3 VOTES)

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

- 1. Approve and delegate authority to the Director of Mental Health to prepare, sign, and execute a Settlement Agreement with United American Indian Involvement, Inc. (UAII) in accordance with the Settlement Agreement format (Attachment I), that is substantially similar to a previously Board approved format. Effective upon Your Board's approval, this agreement will allow United American Indian Involvement, Inc. to repay the County of Los Angeles – Department of Mental Health (DMH) beyond the three months stipulated in its existing contract.
- 2. Approve UAII's repayment of \$97, 171 in six installments of \$16,195 per month.

PURPOSE OF RECOMMENDED ACTIONS:

Board approval of the Settlement Agreement will allow UAII to repay DMH over an extended period beyond the three months allowed under the existing contract provision (Paragraph 4 (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Subparagraph U (Payments Due to County/Method of Payment), Page 27). The extended repayment period will help to mitigate an immediate adverse cash flow impact on UAII as a result of the Loan Reconciliation Settlement for Fiscal Year (FY) 2000-2001. The repayment period does not provide for interest payments on the outstanding balance.

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JUSTIFICATION:

The settlement amount owed to DMH of \$97,171 is to repay Cash Flow Loan Funds that the agency requested that were in excess of the agency's cost of actual services provided for FY 00/01.

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact on DMH's FY 2002-2003 Adopted Budget, as DMH made payments to UAII in a prior fiscal year (FY 2000-2001), which UAII submitted claims for services provided. UAII's repayments will be offset against monthly claims for reimbursement until the entire balance has been repaid. In the event that the monthly claim for reimbursement is insufficient to cover the monthly payments, UAII will be required to remit the difference to DMH.

FINANCING:

Effective upon your Board's approval, UAII will repay DMH \$97,171in six installments of \$16,195 per month.

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS:

Under the existing contract provision (Paragraph 4 (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Subparagraph M (Cash Flow Loan Funds), page 22), "in order to recover CGF provided to Contractor as Cash Flow Loan Funds pursuant to this Subparagraph M, or any amounts due to County by Contractor under this Agreement or otherwise, County shall withhold from any amounts due by County to Contractor under this Agreement."

Under the existing contract provision (Paragraph 4 (FINANCIAL PROVISIONS), Subparagraph U (Payments Due to County/Method of Payment), Page 27), County contract language allows six repayment options and also allows contractors to notify the County as to which option Contractor requests to be used as the method by which such amount shall be recovered by the County.

The repayment of \$97,171 over a three-month period, the longest repayment option, will result in a serious financial hardship on UAII and/or jeopardize its ability to implement and/or expand mental health programs. Therefore, UAII has requested a six months repayment schedule.

CONTRACTING PROCESS:

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Upon Board approval, DMH will execute a Settlement Agreement with UAII for the repayment of funds that extends three months beyond the three months contract provision - or a total of a six months' payment schedule.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES:

Without an approved Settlement Agreement, contractors are required to repay the liability in three installments to the County, which may potentially cause financial problems and affect their ability to maintain an appropriate level of service.

NEGATIVE DECLARATION/ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT REPORTS:

The subject does not apply.

CONCLUSION:
