APPROVAL OF REPORT FOR THE MEDICAID DEMONSTRATION PROJECT (All Districts) (3 Votes)

IT IS RECOMMENDED THAT YOUR BOARD:

Approve the attached First Quarter Report ("Report") for Fiscal Year ("FY") 2002-03 for the Medicaid Demonstration Project, and authorize the Director of Health Services, or his designee, to submit the Report to the State Department of Health Services for transmittal to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services.

PURPOSE/JUSTIFICATION OF RECOMMENDED ACTION:

The recommended action requests that the Board approve and instruct the Director of Health Services to submit the First Quarter Report for FY 2002-03 to the State Department of Health Services ("SDHS" or "State") for transmittal to the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services ("CMS").

The Department of Health Services ("DHS" or "Department") is required to submit reports on a quarterly and annual basis to the State and CMS describing the progress made by the Department in meeting the goals of the Medicaid Demonstration Project ("1115 Waiver," "Demonstration Project," or "Project").

FACTS AND PROVISIONS/LEGAL REQUIREMENTS:

The County is required to submit reports to the State and CMS on a quarterly and annual basis on the progress of the Department in meeting the goals and requirements under the Demonstration Project. On December 8, 1998, the Board instructed the Department to submit progress reports to the Board prior to submission to the State and CMS.

The Report covers the period July 1, 2002 through September 30, 2002. The Report focuses on the major highlights in the critical areas of ambulatory care visits, Federally Qualified Health Centers, Medi-Cal enrollments, Clinical Resource Management, the Workforce Development Program and Patient Assessment Survey, as well as information on referral center workload. Information in the Report has been validated by DHS' Audit and Compliance Division.

It should be noted that the DHS ambulatory care visit numbers reported in the Report are subject to annual validation by the County's Auditor-Controller.

CONTRACTING PROCESS:

The contracting process is not applicable to the Report.

IMPACT ON CURRENT SERVICES (OR PROJECTS):

None of the Report documents has an impact on current services or projects.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

This report summarizes activities and the program status of required deliverables under the five-year extension of the Medicaid Demonstration Project for Fiscal Year (FY) 2002-03. A Milestones Matrix for the First Quarter of FY 2002-03 is also included. Information on patient complaint data and referral center workload are included as attachments.

Major highlights for the First Quarter of FY 2002-03 include:

Ambulatory Care Visits

- The Department of Health Services (DHS) ambulatory care visits for July 2002 through September 2002, as of November 19, 2002, were reported at 590,372.
- DHS Public/Private Partnership-General Relief (PPP/GR) ambulatory care visits for July 2002 through August 2002, as of November 19, 2002, were reported at 118,373.
- The Department of Mental Health (DMH) ambulatory care visits for July 2002 through September 2002, as of November 21, 2002, were reported at 157,239 for DMH-operated sites and 323,925 for DMH-contracted sites; for a total of 481,164 visits.
- On September 24, 2002, the Board of Supervisors approved the new primary care, dental, co-location, takeover, and specialty care agreements, as well as the general relief amendments effective October 1, 2002 through June 30, 2003.

Federally Qualified Health Centers (FQHC)

• In July 2002, four Public/Private Partnership (PPP) agencies were assisted in the preliminary work required for submitting FQHC Look-Alike applications. Six additional agencies will proceed with the preparation and submission of applications for FQHC Look-Alike designation based on assessments completed in July and August 2002.

• The Office of Ambulatory Care continued to work with County DHS representatives, the Chief Administrative Office, County Counsel, and two FQHC project consultants in the preparation of DHS and PPP applications for FQHC and FQHC Look-Alike status.

Medi-Cal Enrollments

• Based on the December 1, 2002 MEDS report for the September 2002 month of eligibility, the County reported 1,370,490 Certified Eligibles, exceeding the FY 2002-03 goal of enrolling 1,047,400 Medi-Cal eligibles by 323,090.

Clinic Resource Management (CRM)

- The Planned Cesarean Section and Labor Induction and Delivery inpatient clinical pathway components are being finalized.
- The development of Orthopedic and Laparoscopic Appendectomy inpatient clinical pathways components are underway.

Workforce Development Program (WDP)

- Thirty-eight Licensed Vocational Nurses completed a thirty-nine hour program in Intravenous procedures.
- Forty-six Registered Nurses (RNs) completed a two day training in preceptorship, providing them with skills to guide and support new RNs and RNs already in demanding wards.
- Ten RNs continued their participation in the July 2002 through November 2002 emergency room course at El Camino Community College.
- In September 2002, thirteen RNs began a Critical Care Program at El Camino Community College.
- In September 2002, twenty-six RNs completed an EKG Interpretation course at El Camino Community College.

Patient Assessment Survey (PAS)

• On-site data collection was completed. A total of 2,350 full interviews and 171 pre-visit surveys were completed.

• The Patient Assessment Survey Initial Progress Report was submitted to the State DHS on August 21, 2002. The report summarized survey progress to date and included detailed information on the survey methodology, number of participating sites, number of patients surveyed, and response rates.










Trends in First Month Reporting of Medi-Cal Eligibles July 2002 through June 2003
