A recent study, conducted by court-appointed water master Mel Belvins, reveals that ground water contaminated with Chromium 6 has migrated near wells and water-treatment facilities that service the cities of Burbank, Glendale, and Los Angeles. The report calls for federal intervention to order the 60 companies suspected of ground water contamination to add Chromium 6 to the list of pollutants the companies are currently required to remove from water supplies.

The report also calls for the Environmental Protection Agency to lead cleanup efforts of the contaminated groundwater and for the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board to issue cleanup and abatement orders.

I, THEREFORE, MOVE that the Board of Supervisors send five-signature letters to the Environmental Protection Agency urging the agency to lead a cleanup effort, and to the Los Angeles Regional Water Quality Control Board to issue cleanup and abatement orders.
