Recently, Congressmen David Dreier and Howard Berman reintroduced legislation (HR 715) that provides wage-based tax relief for film and television projects produced in the United States. The United States Independent Film and Television Production Incentive Act of 2003 would create incentives to keep production projects in the United States.
